Dear Village of Marvin Voters,

The Marvin Village Council proposed an amendment to the Marvin Village Charter. This equates to a change to our Village 'Constitution'. The amendment would allow the Mayor to vote on all matters. Per NC law, cities usually ensure changes to the city Charter are put to a referendum. However, should officials refuse, citizens can compel the officials to put the charter amendment to a vote of the people, using a <u>referendum petition</u>. The referendum petition you are receiving seeks to collect enough signatures to ensure Marvin residents are granted a referendum and a chance to vote.

An amendment to the Village Charter is not a decision to be taken lightly. Marvin Village voters deserve the right to:

- (1) ... Participate in conversations over options
- (2) ... Contemplate the impacts of a change
- (3) ... Cast a vote in a Village referendum

Providing any Mayor with the right to vote on all matters would have lasting impacts on the Village and the balance of power. It would give the Mayor overriding control over future Council vacancies, Village boards, and development in the Village, long into Marvin's future.

Despite this, the Council majority is rushing the change through without sincerely garnering voter input. They held the public hearing on the soonest possible day, at 9 am when most residents could not attend. They also refused to listen to residents who asked that efforts be halted and/or decelerate.

To secure our right to vote our community has 30 days to collect approximately 500 signatures. There's no time to waste! With a little focus and determination we can take a big democratic stand in our small community.
